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CALL MEETING TO ORDER-The opening meeting statement was read, and the Town Board of Supervisors monthly meeting was called to order at 6:00 P.M. by Chairman Ragen at the Town Hall. The meeting agenda notice was properly posted.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Allen moved to approve the agenda as printed, seconded by Pribyl. Motion carried, voice vote.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING(S)-Pribyl motioned to approve all 4 sets of minutes (March 8, 2021 Regular meeting, March 18, 2021 Special meeting, March 26, 2021 Special meeting and April 8, 2021 Special meeting) as printed, seconded by Allen. Motion carried, voice vote.

CORRESPONDENCE-Ragen mentioned the Town Board was invited to and may attend the WTA-Oconto County Unit meeting on April 29, 2021 at 7:00pm at the Breed Community Center.

Business #1: Conduct Town Board Oath of Office-Tolzman conducted the Oath of Office for the elected Town Board members, Chair Elmer Ragen, Supervisor David Pribyl and Supervisor Douglas Allen, Sr.

Business #2: Relocation of Drainage Easement in Lot 38 of Hogan's Norway Pines Second Addition-Action May Be Taken-Glen Calewarts explained the need for a drainage easement in Lot 38 of Hogan's Norway Pines Second Addition that needs to be moved. Q & A's from the public and Board followed. Ragen will contact Oconto County to shoot grade to determine placement of discharge and proper flow. Pribyl motioned to accept the relocation of the drainage easement, seconded by Allen. Motion carried, voice vote.

Business #3: Resolution R2021-2 Relocation of Drainage Easement-Action May Be Taken-Pribyl motioned to approve the Relocation of Drainage Easement-Resolution R2021-2, seconded by Allen. Motion carried, voice vote.

Business #4: Resolution R2021-3 Petition for Bridge Aid-Sandalwood Road-Action May Be Taken-This Bridge Aid for Sandalwood Rd culvert is at an estimated cost of \$8,235.37. The Town Board is petitioning for \$4,117.69 to Oconto County to defray one-half of the estimated cost. Allen motioned to approve Resolution R2021-3-Petition for Bridge Aid, seconded by Pribyl. Motion carried, voice vote.

Business #5: Community Policing Report-Deputy LeBreck reviewed the March activity. There was a total of 125 incidents. This report can be found on the Town website. LeBreck's report also included a summary of the local

burglaries that took place last fall and this spring and how local businesses added cameras allowing our local police access to them. Public Q & A's took place regarding the municipal court.

Business #6: Discuss LSFDF Entry Door Key FOB System-Action May Be Taken-Chief Zuge presented a quote from Martin Systems to install an Access Control System to the Fire Dept entry doors in the amount of \$6,685. The Town Board asked to wait until there is further direction on the use of the American Rescue Plan Act funds. No Action Was Taken.

Business #7: Fire Department Report-Zuge reported they had 6 calls in the March-1 motorcycle accident with lift assist, a brush fire, a rollover in Abrams' jurisdiction, a semi fire on Hwy 41 and 2 County Rescue lift assists with CPR. The department is needing the Air Paks to be replaced that were purchased in 2002. They have exceeded their 15-year life expectancy and state requirements. Zuge received 2 quotes for 20 Paks ranging in cost from \$141,000-\$148,560.

Business #8: Road Report-Ragen shared there is ditching and drainage to be done. The Cross Rd bid opening will take place near the 1<sup>st</sup> week of May. There are culverts that require replacing due to the frost and high-water table. Some roads will be pulverized for the same reasons. Please **do not voluntarily** clean up the road ditches currently. Oconto County Emergency Services will be reviewing the safety measures. There have been too many incidents with plastic bottles exploding and other dangerous debris.

Business #9: Plan Commission Report-There was no Plan Commission meeting this month. There are potential commercial opportunities being discussed. Housing sales are up, and lumber prices are extremely high.

Business #10: Set Next Meeting Date-The next meeting date was set for Monday, May 10, 2021.

Business #11: Adjournment- Ragen adjourned the meeting at 7:08 P.M.
